MEDICAL ASSISTANCE IN DYING (MAID)

1. What are my CHOICES?

Your doctor or nurse can tell you about the different types of care you can have in hospital, at home, or in a hospice as your condition gets worse. Some of these options are:

- Pain medications and other palliative care supports.
- Sedation in some cases (leads to deep sleep or coma).
- MAID.

2. Where can I find out MORE about MAID and how do I ask for it?

- A helpful website is: https://www.canada.ca/ en/health-canada/.
- Speak to your doctor or nurse.
- They will answer your questions or must find you someone who can.

3. What happens if I CHOOSE to have MAID?

- Two health care providers will meet with you and ask you questions about your health and what you hope for.
- They will decide if you meet the conditions for MAID.

4. What can I do if I am REJECTED for MAID?

You have the right to ask for another opinion.

5. I am ACCEPTED for MAID. Now what?

- Your MAID provider will ask you to fill in a Patient Request Record Form and get an independent witness for it, if not already done.
- To find a witness you can call: 1-877-389-1251.
- You may plan to have MAID immediately or you can wait until later to decide on a date and time.
- You can change your mind at any time about having MAID.

6. PREPARING for the day

If there is a WAITING period, use this time to:

- Spend time with people you love and say what you need to say.
- Do the things you love.
- Share your story in words, pictures, or videos.
- Make plans for the day if you have decided on a date—including any rituals you may wish.
- While you wait for MAID, you will continue to receive the care you need for all your symptoms.

Make PLANS.

Talk with your MAID provider and decide:

- Where will you have MAID?
- Who will be there?
- What do you want to do, see, eat, and feel on this day?

Ask any questions you have about:

- · What to expect.
- What will happen if you get sicker very quickly?
- What if you get confused and cannot give consent on the day of MAID?

Make plans for what happens after MAID (e.g., ceremony, funeral, burial, cremation).

7. On the DAY

- When your MAID provider arrives, they will ask you if you still want MAID.
- They may also ask you to sign a consent form (depending on your province).
- Your MAID provider will make sure you are comfortable and will give you drugs that place you into a coma that ends in immediate death.
